Plans are for 17,000 square feet of shopping center uses. This agreement is made subject to a performance schedule and payment of an annual renewal fee for the reservation of traffic circulation capacity.

This agreement is made subject to a performance schedule and payment of an annual renewal fee for the reservation of traffic circulation capacity.

Bill Summary: This bill appoints Jane G. Carr to the Jacksonville-Duval County Council on Elder Affairs, replacing Henry Cook as the representative for Council District 3, for a partial term ending June 30, 2012.

Background Information: The Jacksonville-Duval County Council on Elder Affairs is established pursuant to Chapter 82, Jacksonville Municipal Code, and charged to serve as an advocate, for the older persons in the city, to the governmental agencies responsible for the various plans and programs designed to help older persons; assist in the implementation of plans and programs selected by regional organizations, as they relate to the city and its citizens; and designate priorities among programs developed in the city by public, nonprofit and private providers concerning older persons. Section 82.101, Jacksonville Municipal Code, provides that fourteen of the members of the Council on Elder Affairs shall be appointed by the City Council, with one nominee from each of the District Council Members.

Ms. Carr received a bachelor's degree in health science from the University of St. Francis and is a retired Registered Nurse. She resides in the Beacon Hills area within Council District #1.

Bill Summary: The bill amends City Charter Article 5 – The Council – and Article 13 – Duval County School Board – to transfer the power and duty to periodically redraw school board districts from the City Council to the Duval County School Board. It provides for a transition period during which the current districts will remain in effect until such time as the School District adopts new districts and authorizes the Supervisor of Elections to place a referendum on the ballot either of the November 2012 general election or any preceding county-wide election ballot.

Background Information: The City Charter currently provides that adjacent City Council districts are paired to create the 7 School Board districts. Initial research indicates that the Duval County School Board is the only school board in Florida that does not draw its own electoral district boundaries. Several school boards voluntarily utilize their county commission's districts for school board purposes as well, presumably to reduce confusion from multiple sets of non-matching districts and to utilize the time and effort of the county's redistricting process for two purposes. During this year's City Council redistricting process School Board pointed out how various map proposals would affect school board representation of different constituencies and would impact school feeder patterns.

Bill Summary: This ordinance approves the settlement in eminent domain of the owners' damages in a total amount of \$277,400.00 and statutory attorney's fees in the amount of \$72,000.00 and recoverable costs in the amount of \$41,150.00,for a total monetary settlement of \$340,550.00, with the difference between the previously deposited amount and the total monetary settlement being \$163,150.00, all resulting from the condemnation of parcels 111, 711.1 and 711.2, in relation to the Greenland Road Project in Council District 5, in the proceeding styled City of Jacksonville v. Franklin D. Chapman, et al., Case No. 2007-CA-000951.

Background Information: The City of Jacksonville filed an eminent domain action in this proceeding (City v Chapman et al) for the construction of roadway and related improvements to Greenland Road in Mandarin. The City acquired 4,664 square feet in fee simple to widen Greenland Road and 2,615 square feet for temporary construction space from property owned by Wiginton Fire Sprinklers, Inc. ("owners"). The City and the owners disputed the value of the damages associated with the condemnation; the parties have engaged in settlement discussions for claims in excess of the previously deposited \$177,400.00. The Jacksonville Municipal Code requires that the City Council approve a settlement when the total amount of the settlement is \$50,000.00 more than the amount of money posted by the City at the time of the Order of Taking. The total monetary settlement in this eminent domain settlement is \$163,150.00.

Bill Summary: This bill confirms the School Board's appointment of B.J. Laster as a member of the Civil Service Board, replacing Babette Ashley, for a partial term ending June 30, 2012, followed by a first full three-year term ending June 30, 2015.

Background Information: The Civil Service Board is established pursuant to Article 17, Jacksonville Charter, and charged to periodically review the operation and effect of the personnel provisions of the charter, the classification plan, and the pay plan, and report their findings to the council and the mayor; hear and determine appeals initiated by employees who are charged with personnel violations; hear and determine complaints by employees and prospective employees concerning alleged violations of civil service rules or regulations with respect to hiring and promotion; hear and determine the grievance of persons covered by the civil service rules or the grievance of persons who may be entitled to be covered concerning any action taken which pertains to employment rights.

Section 17.02(b), Jacksonville Charter, provides that one of the members of the Civil Service Board shall be appointed by the Duval County School Board, subject to confirmation by the City Council.

Ms. Laster received a master's degree in education from the University of Central Arkansas and is a Supervisor/Liaison with the State Attorney's Office. She resides in the Lakewood area within Council District #9.
