PURPOSE/SUMMARY: To appropriate funds from FEMA through the Florida Division of Emergency Management for the Flood Mitigation Assistance (FMA) program. This grant provides funding for a Property Acquisition/ Demolition of Structures Project between the City of Jacksonville, and property owner Ms. Rhonda Greene, 3915 San Jose Blvd., which has sustained repetitive flooding. The City will enter into agreement with Ms. Greene, with FEMA grant funding, for the expenses to acquire her property, demolish structures and slabs, and remove debris associated with the project. Required matching funds to be provided by homeowner as follows:

Ms. Greene, 3915 San Jose Blvd., Jacksonville (FMA) 75% Federal Share and 25% Local Share
Federal Share (75%) \$ 253,779.00
Local Share (25%) \$ 84,593.00 (responsibility of the property owner)
