- 1. The subject property is legally described in the original legal description dated January 9, 2014.
- 2. The subject property shall be developed in accordance with the original written description

- dated April 16, 2014.
- 3. The subject property shall be developed in accordance with the original site plan dated April 11, 2014.
- 4. The subject property shall be developed in accordance with the Development Services Division Memorandum dated May 15, 2014 or as otherwise approved by the Planning and Development Department, except that the traffic signal warrant study would only be required when a phase with new direct access to University Boulevard is reviewed.
- *Additions made by PC to the proposed Jacksonville Planning and Development Department ("JPDD") conditions are <u>underlined</u> and deletions are indicated with a strikethrough. If there are more than three conditions, the Ordinance should be amended.
- Recommended PC Conditions that can be incorporated into the Written Description: NONE
- PC Commentary:

The initial phases of development involve parcels with access through the Jacksonville University campus rather than directly onto University Boulevard. As the initial phases will not involve a new access point on University Boulevard, a traffic signal warrant study would be premature. The traffic signal warrant study will now be required when a phase containing direct access onto University Boulevard is reviewed.
