This request will authorize an interlocal agreement between the City of Jacksonville (COJ) and Jacksonville Aviation Authority (JAA). The agreement provides for the COJ to build a new Fire Station, Station 73, off Aviation Blvd on propomed by JAA. This Fire Station was included in the adopted CIP as a relocation of Fire Station 56 but due to recent economic development announced in the area, the FAA requires the current Fire Station 56 to remain at its current lor (on the runway, inside Cecil Field).  The COJ has agreed to procure and manage a contract to construct a 4-bay Fire Station on the Aviation Blvd property lease it from JAA. The JAA applied and received a grant from the Florida Department of Transportation to contribute construction of Fire Station 73. The grant agreement is attached.
