The Duval County Shore Protection Project is a cooperatively funded program among the Federal Government, through the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (USACE), the State, through the Florida Department of Environmental Protection (FDEP), and the City of Jacksonville (COJ) focused on renourishing the beaches along Duval County. While renourishment projects are accomplished by need that can fluctuate given erosion rates and hurricanes, under normal conditions these projects occur at approximately five year intervals. The two most recent renourishment projects were conducted in 2011 and 2016. The federal government share of project funding is 61.6% and the non-federal share is 38.4% - this ratio is established by USACE through the Water Resources Development Act (WRDA). Of the non-federal costs, the FDEP share is 46.89% and the COJ share is 53.11%. The FDEP/COJ ratio is established by FDEP and is based upon the amounts and location of public beach access (parking). This FDEP/COJ cost-share ratio is codified in the current State Cost-Share Agreement between FDEP and COJ #15DU1. This legislation is to amend the current 15DU1 agreement to modify the scope to include an increase in design and permitting, monitoring and construction tilling of the shoreline and extends the expiration date to July 31, 2018. This Budget Transfer (BT) will amend the appropriations previously approved as part of Ordinance 2016 - 177 ultimately reducing the COJ share and increasing the FDEP share of the 2016 renourishment effort. COJ funds, previously earmarked for the FY 16 renourishment effort, which are now freed up will be reappropriated to a cash carryover line item in order to begin accumulating/saving funds for the next renourishment effort.

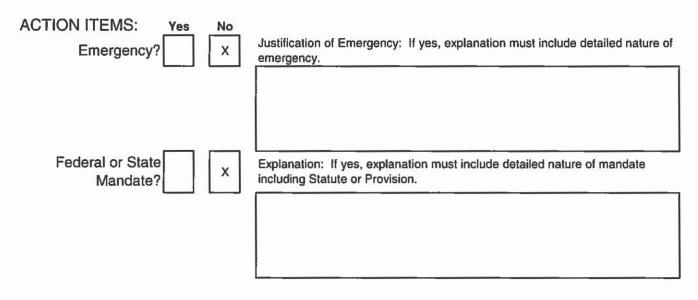

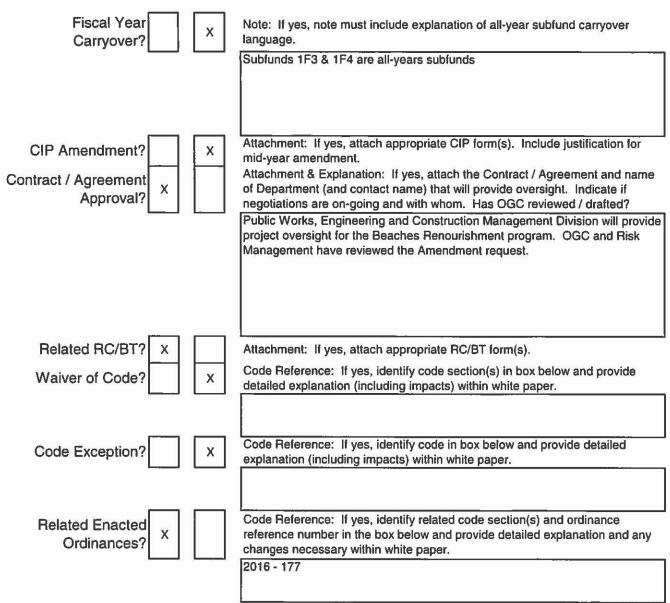

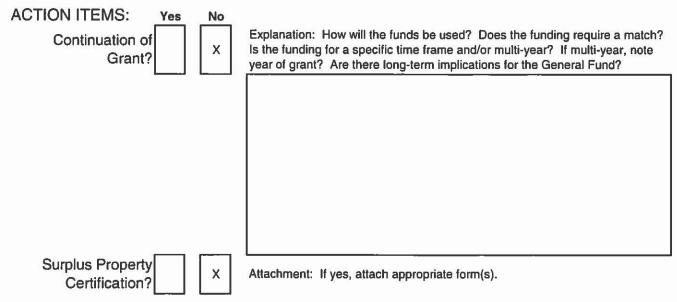
