Staff Report on the 2018 Assessment Report for the 2030 Comprehensive Plan

RESOLUTION 2019-255

Resolution 2019-255 adopts the 2018 Assessment Report for the 2030 Comprehensive Plan and states the City's intent to implement the recommendations contained in the assessment. The 2018 Assessment Report includes the final recommendations of the 2030 Comprehensive Plan Local Major Issues Committee.

The Comprehensive Plan is a high-level policy document required by both local and state regulations that establishes the City's long-term growth and development goals and identifies the types of programs and regulations that must be implemented in order to achieve the stated goals. The original Comprehensive Plan was adopted in 1990 and has since been amended by various ordinances resulting in the current 2030 Comprehensive Plan.

The 2018 Assessment Report of the 2030 Comprehensive Plan provides:

- Updated population projections based on a 2045 planning timeframe.
- A review of plan implementation since the last assessment was completed in 2007.
- Major growth and development issues for the City and recommendations to address the issues as defined by the Local Major Issues Committee.
- An assessment of whether the plan objectives within each element have been achieved and recommendations to address any issues as defined by subject matter experts from the various City of Jacksonville departments and independent agencies.

The Local Major Issues Committee recommendations form a substantial component of the report. The Committee consisted of one member of the City Council and eight members that served on either the Office of Mayor Lenny Curry Transition Teams Subcommittees or on the Blueprint for Improvement II Task Force on Consolidated Government.
