<b>PURPOSE/ SUMMARY:</b> Deutsche Bank (DB) is considering expanding their investment banking back office functions in Jacksonville and exploring other highly specialized roles in technology, front office, and finance jobs that could potentially be located in Jacksonville. The proposed expansion of their U.S. nearshore operations hub for DB supports their operations strategy to continue to diversify their operating centers away from the company's hubs in New York/New Jersey, London, and Singapore.							
DB expects this expansion to create 260 new, full-time economic-based jobs in a three year period (2013 to 2015) within its subsidiaries, DB Services New Jersey, Inc. (DBS), DB Services Americas, Inc. (DBSA), and Deutsche Bank Securities, Inc. (DBSI). Collectively, these subsidiaries are referred to herein as "Company". These 260 new, high skill jobs will pay an average wage of approximately \$46,638 plus benefits, which is 115% of the statewide average wage. These jobs would require individuals with knowledge of investment banking and IT support. The company also proposes to invest \$10.3 million in leasehold improvements and furniture and technology infrastructure.							
DB and Company are seeking public investment through the Qualified Targeted Industry (QTI) Tax Refund program, with High Impact Sector Bonus, and Recapture Enhanced Value (REV) grant. An expected average wage of approximately \$46,638 which equals 115 percent of the state average and qualifies the company for \$3,000 per job under this state program, and an additional \$2,000 per job for the High Impact Sector Bonus for a total of \$1,300,000 to offset a portion of its expenses for the expansion of its operations in Jacksonville. The city portion of the QTI is 20 percent of the basic award up to \$260,000. The proposed REV grant would be provided on an annual basis and would be equal to 35 percent of the incremental increase in municipal and county ad valorem taxes paid on leasehold improvements and personal property at the project site for a period of five years. The amount of this grant is directly commensurate to a portion of the incremental increase in value associated with the company's lease hold improvements and tangible personal property investment. This grant will have a cap of \$138,000. No BT is required at this time as funding will be requested in the appropriate budget cycle.
